**INSTRUCTIONS TO BIDDERS

1. Sealed proposals will be received by the City of Sycamore herein also referred to as "Owner" on the 16th day of July, 2025 up to the hour of 10:00 A.M. for certain storm sewer and ditch improvements in the Parkside Drive area of Sycamore, Illinois, in accordance with the Instructions to Bidders, Proposal, Plans, Specifications, Bonds and Contract for said work. All proposals must be delivered to the Sycamore Center at 308 West State Street in Sycamore, Illinois, not later than the date and time herein specified.
2. All proposals must be submitted upon the blank forms furnished by the Owner. Proposals that contain any omissions, erasures or alterations or that contain additions or omissions or items not called for in the Contract or Specifications or contain irregularities of any kind, may be rejected as informal.
3. All signatures shall be in handwriting and no proposal will be considered unless properly signed by the bidder or his or its legally authorized agent or representative with addresses given in the correct spaces provided in the proposal and in accordance with the directions set forth opposite of said spaces.
4. When a corporation submits a proposal, its agent must present legal evidence that he has lawful authority to sign said proposal and that the corporation has legal existence. In the event that any corporation organized and doing business under the law of any foreign state is the successful bidder, such corporation must present evidence, before any contract is executed, that it is authorized to do business in the State of Illinois.
5. Each proposal shall be placed in a sealed envelope addressed to Mary Kalk City Clerk, City of Sycamore, which said envelope shall be endorsed as follows: "Proposal of (name of bidder) for "Parkside Drive Storm Sewer/Ditch Project in Sycamore, Illinois."
6. Each bidder shall deposit with this proposal a Proposal Guarantee consisting of a Certified or Cashier's Check, Bank Money Order, or Bid Bond in an amount of not less than 5% of the total amount of bid as a guarantee that in case the bidder's proposal is accepted, the bidder shall, within ten days after the date of such acceptance and notification thereof, deliver to the Owner a contract signed and executed by the contractor
7. No bidder may withdraw his, their, or its bid after the same is submitted to and received by the Clerk.
8. The Owner reserves the right to reject any or all bids and to waive or not to waive any informalities therein and to select the bid which is in the best interest of the City of Sycamore.
9. The City of Sycamore's local bidder preference policy is not applicable for this project however a responsible bidder policy is applicable, a copy of which are included in these contract documents following the Special Provisions.

Local Roads And Streets Recurring Special Provisions

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The following Special Provision supplement the "Standard Specifications for Road and Bridge Construction", adopted

January 1, 2022

, the latest edition of the "Manual on Uniform Traffic Control Devices for Streets and Highways", and the "Manual of Test Procedures of Materials" in effect on the date of invitation of bids, and the Supplemental Specification and Recurring Special Provisions indicated on the Check Sheet included here in which apply to and govern the construction of the above named section, and in case of conflict with any parts, or parts of said Specifications, the said Special Provisions shall take precedence and shall govern.

LOCATION OF PROJECT

The Storm Sewer/Parkside Ditch Improvement Project is located on the east and west sides of Parkside Drive approximately 250 feet north of Lincolnshire Drive and also includes ditch and storm sewer construction east of Parkside Drive out into the Sycamore Park District's golf course. A Location Map is included following the last page of these Special Provisions that shows the construction limits of the project.

DESCRIPTION OF WORK

The project includes the construction of a low flow 30" storm sewer from Parkside Drive east approximately 900 feet to discharge into the existing drainage ditch located in the Sycamore Park District's golf course for the purpose of maintaining positive flow in the upstream pipe culvert and storm sewers at Parkside Drive. Also included in this work is ditch grading, precast block erosion control mat and the construction of a sediment basin, all on the west side of Parkside Drive and work on the east side of Parkside Drive includes ditch grading, a reinforced concrete headwall/wingwall, concrete paved ditch, tree removal, sidewalk removal and replacement, slope wall removal, pipe culvert and storm sewer cleaning, precast block erosion control mat, landscaping, restoration and all appurtenances.

SPECIAL PROJECT REQUIREMENTS

The following special project requirements are applicable to this project.

1. Access for all of the work area on the east side of Parkside Drive out into the golf course shall be along the south side of the drainage ditch. The pipe railing located at the back of sidewalk on the east side of Parkside Drive can be removed for access to the work site and shall be replaced upon completion of the project. The permanent easement area on the east side of Parkside Drive runs from near the south wall of the building at 506 Parkside Drive to 50' south. This existing easement area adjoining 506 and 516 Parkside Drive is shown on Sheet 2 of the Plans and marked as a UE. Contractor shall erect 4' high orange plastic mesh safety fencing all along the edge of the easement for the 506 and 515 Parkside Drive properties in order to prevent construction equipment, materials, vehicles, etc. from encroaching upon property that is not within the designated easement area.
2. An approximate 150' x 150' staging area located on the north side of the ditch is being made available for Contractor's use for the storage of materials and equipment and is shown on Sheet 3 of the Plans. Upon completion of the project, the staging area shall be restored to its original condition.
3. The storm sewer work in the golf course can begin any time after September 2, 2025. Once the 30" storm sewer work begins, Contractor shall complete ditch grading, topsoil, seeding and placing the precast block erosion control mat downstream of the 30" flared end section as well as laying and backfilling the 30" storm sewer from the flared end section at the ditch to 110' west of ST-2 within twenty-one (21) calendar days of the start of construction so the interruption of the normal play on the golf course is kept to a minimum. The remaining 30" storm sewer back to ST-6 and beyond at Parkside Drive shall be laid and backfilled within an additional twenty-one (21) days so that all underground storm sewer work is completed in the golf course within this time frame described herein. Landscape restoration work to follow in a timely order.

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4. Work at Parkside Drive, including tree removal, slope wall removal, cleaning pipe culvert and storm sewers, ditch grading, precast block erosion control mat and installation of sediment basin at west side of Parkside Drive, etc. can begin any time after August 18, 2025.
5. Any existing water lines or electric lines in conflict with the proposed storm sewer grade shall be neatly cut and removed by Contractor so storm sewer can be constructed at the proposed grade as staked. Replacement of water lines and electric lines that have been cut to be completed by Park District's contractor at a later date and that work is not part of this contract.
6. No upstream flow shall be permitted to drain into the new 30" storm sewer until the ditch grading, precast block erosion control mat and new sediment basin has been constructed on the west side of Parkside Drive and the HE 68" x 106" pipe culvert and 36" and 42" storm sewers have been completely cleaned of all sediment and debris.
7. The wood bridge shown on the Plans crossing the ditch between 506 & 516 Parkside Drive will be removed by the Sycamore Public Works Dept. and not be replaced.
8. Access to the work area on the west side of Parkside Drive can be entered by removing the pipe railing located at the back of sidewalk. Upon completion of the work, the pipe railing shall be replaced. Protect adjoining sidewalk and slope wall during the construction work in this area. Do not use the adjoining driveway located on the north side of the ditch.

TREE REMOVAL (6 TO 15 UNITS DIAMETER)

TREE REMOVAL (OVER 15 UNITS DIAMETER)

This work shall be completed in accordance with Section 201 of the Standard Specifications and also includes for each of the trees removed, complete stump removal to 15" below the proposed finished grade.

All costs of this work shall be included in the unit price bid per unit diameter for TREE REMOVAL (6 TO 15 UNITS DIAMETER) and TREE REMOVAL (OVER 15 UNITS DIAMETER).

GRANULAR BEDDING & BACKFILL MATERIAL SPECIAL

This work shall be completed in accordance with Section 208 and 1004 of the Standard Specifications, as applicable, and shall include all CA-7 bedding, embedment and backfill materials for the storm sewers, structures, paved ditch, sidewalks, etc. The CA-7 granular material shall be crushed limestone with limited fines. Also included is the necessary CA-6 crushed stone required for the top 8" of backfill for the golf cart paths which is included in the tonnage for this pay item. All excess excavated material from all storm sewer trenches shall be removed from the site at contractor's expense.

All costs of this work shall be included in the unit price bid per ton for GRANULAR BEDDING & BACKFILL MATERIAL SPECIAL.

GRADING AND SHAPING DITCHES

This work shall be completed in accordance with Section 214 of the Specifications and shall include all the grading and shaping of the ditches as shown on the Plans as well as removing any bushes or small trees less than 6" diameter in the ditch area. All excess excavated material and any unsuitable material shall be removed from the site by Contractor with no additional compensation. A quantity of 110 lineal feet of ditch grading and shaping has also been included in the project where it may be required adjoining the 30" storm sewer installation between ST-2 and ST-3.

All costs of this work shall be included in the unit price bid per foot for GRADING AND SHAPING DITCHES.

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SEEDING (COMPLETE)

This work shall be completed in accordance with Sections 211, 212, 250, 251 and 1081 of the Standard Specifications and shall include final shaping, trimming and grading in preparing all disturbed grass areas for topsoil where the storm sewer has been constructed as well as where excavated materials have been placed during the trench excavation, also the staging area used for the storage of materials and equipment and beneath the proposed precast block erosion control mat, all as per the plans and as required by City. Work to include replacing the topsoil which was removed and also includes furnishing and placing any additional topsoil that may be required to a variable depth in all disturbed areas, application of a starter fertilizer 24-25-4 and seeding same with an IDOT Class 1 Lawn Mixture at the rate of 150#/acre and covering the seeded areas with a double knitted photo-degradable straw erosion control blanket. The seeding beneath the precast block erosion control mat shall be an IDOT Class 4A Low Profile Native Grass Mixture with a drought resistant perennial wild flower mixture similar to IDOT Class 5 Forb Mixture as approved by the City. The wild flowers to be sown at the rate of 10#/acre. In addition biodegradable plastic staples shall be used for anchoring the straw erosion control blanket for the Class 1 seeding areas. Any topsoil material that is imported shall comply with the requirements of Article 1081.05(a) of the Standard Specifications. All landscape restoration to be completed by November 21, 2025. Any damaged landscaped restored areas or trench settlement that may occur by May 15, 2026 shall be repaired by placing additional topsoil, fertilizer, seed and blanket in these areas with no additional compensation.

All costs of this work shall be included in the lump sum price bid for SEEDING (COMPLETE).

EXPLORATORY EXCAVATION

This work shall be completed in accordance with the Standard Specifications with a quantity of 20 C.Y. being included in this contract where it may be necessary to explore and excavate in advance of the storm sewer construction to determine any conflicts.

All costs of this work shall be included in the unit price bid per cubic yard for EXPLORATORY EXCAVATION.

TEMPORARY EROSION CONTROL SYSTEM

This work shall be completed in accordance with Section 280 of the Standard Specifications and IDOT Standard 280001-07 and shall include constructing silt fence as per the plans in order to intercept water borne silt and sediment from entering the adjoining open drainage ditch as well as placing temporary non woven geotextile fabric in front of or over any openings in structures and piping to prevent the entry of silt into said storm sewer. Also included in this work shall be the removal of all silt fence and posts upon the completion of the seeding and blanket on the disturbed grass areas which are to be restored.

All costs of this work shall be included in the lump sum price bid for TEMPORARY EROSION CONTROL SYSTEM.

PRECAST BLOCK EROSION CONTROL MAT

This work shall include furnishing and placing a precast block erosion control mat in locations as shown on the Plans. The mat shall not be placed until the topsoil has been spread and fine graded over the subgrade and the area fertilized and seeded. The mat that is required adjoining each side of the paved concrete ditch shall be furnished in 8' widths. The edge of the mat adjoining the paved concrete ditch shall be turned down 18" into a trench and grouted with a portland cement grout. The upper end of the mat on the top of the 2:1 slope shall also be turned down 18" into a trench and grouted. Joints between mats that are perpendicular

to channel flow shall be installed by the shingle method with the downstream mat to be installed a minimum of 18" beneath the upstream adjoining mat and shall be securely fastened together. The installation of the precast block erosion control in the three areas where the existing ditch is being regraded and shaped shall be as outlined above and in accordance with the manufacturer's recommendations. Once the mat has been laid in position it shall be anchored with 18" U shaped 1/2" galvanized steel rebar with minimum spacing of one rebar anchor per each 40 S.F. of the mat laid. Payment will be for material measured in place and will include the material which is buried and grouted as well as the extra material used to lay mat by the shingle method beneath the adjoining mat. The precast block erosion control mat shall be the ShoreFlex Ultra UV with the DNC (Double Net Coconut) backing or an approved equal.

All costs of this work shall be included in the unit price bid per square foot for PRECAST BLOCK EROSION CONTROL MAT.

PCC SIDEWALK 6 INCH SPECIAL

This work shall be completed in accordance with Section 424 of the Standard Specifications and shall include furnishing, placing and finishing the concrete sidewalk. Also included in this work is the furnishing, placing and compacting of 3" of CA-7 crushed limestone base material beneath the proposed sidewalk which is being paid for separately as Granular Bedding & Backfill Material Special. The additional excavation required for any increased sidewalk depth shall be included in the cost of the sidewalk replacement. Where the replacement sidewalk adjoins the existing sidewalk or existing or replaced curb and gutter, No. 4 tie bars 15" long at 12" centers shall be drilled 3" into the adjoining sidewalk slab and/or curb and gutter. Tooled contraction joints 1" in depth shall be provided in the sidewalk at 5' maximum centers. For the 6" sidewalk, the Contractor shall sawcut through all of the tooled contraction joints to 1 1/2" depth within ten (10) days. Contractor shall be responsible for protecting the newly poured sidewalk from damage from vehicles, pedestrians, animals, vandalism, rain, leaves, visqueen marks, etc. until it has hardened sufficiently to prevent any damage to the surface. Damaged sidewalks, as solely determined by City, shall be removed and replaced at Contractor's expense. The finished concrete shall be sprayed with two coats of a curing and sealing compound approved by City.

All costs of this work shall be included in the unit price bid per square foot for PCC SIDEWALK, 6 INCH SPECIAL.

STORM SEWERS RCP CLASS 2 (RUBBER GASKET), 30"

STORM SEWERS RCP CLASS 4 (RUBBER GASKET), 30"

This work shall be completed in accordance with Section 550 of the Standard Specifications and the detail included in the Specifications and shall include all excavation and any dewatering, if necessary. All bedding, embedment and granular backfill material is being paid for separately. The RCP shall conform to the ASTM C- 76 Standards for the class of pipe specified with all joints being O-Ring Joints conforming to ASTM C 361 Standards. All materials used for backfilling the sewer trench shall be placed in 12" maximum lifts and mechanically compacted to the satisfaction of the Engineer. All excess excavated material shall be removed from the site by Contractor with no additional compensation.

All cost of this work shall be included in the unit price bid per foot for STORM SEWERS RCP CLASS 2 (RUBBER GASKET), 30" AND STORM SEWERS RCP CLASS 4 (RUBBER GASKET), 30".

MANHOLES TYPE A, 5' DIA. SPECIAL FRAME, CLOSED LID

This work shall be completed in accordance with the Standard Specifications and Standard 602402-03, as applicable. Manholes to have poured concrete flow lines and shall be furnished with flexible rubber boots

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for pipe connections. Each manhole shall be furnished with a heavy duty frame and closed lid with "STORM" imprinted thereon with said castings as noted in the Storm Sewer Structure Schedule on Sheet 2 of the Plans or an approved equal.

All costs of this work shall be included in the unit price bid per each MANHOLES TYPE A, 5' DIA. SPECIAL FRAME, CLOSED LID.

CATCH BASINS, 6' DIA. SPECIAL FRAME, OPEN LID

This work shall be completed in accordance with Section 602 of the Standard Specifications and shall be similar to Standard 602001-02 except the wall thickness shall be 5" and the structure shall be furnished with flexible rubber boots for pipe connections. Catch basin shall be furnished with a 2' deep sump and shall be furnished with a heavy duty frame and open lid with said castings as noted in the Storm Sewer Structure Schedule on Sheet 2 of the Plans or an approved equal.

All costs of this work shall be included in the unit price per each CATCH BASINS 6' DIA SPECIAL FRAME, OPEN LID.

PRECAST R.C. SEDIMENT BASIN, 4' X 9' X 2.50' DEEP

This work shall be completed in accordance with Section 602 of the Standard Specifications and shall include all excavation, furnishing and installing a rectangular sediment basin as shown on Sheet 2 of the Plans. An 8" deep concrete transition pad with 3/4" steel expansion tie anchors is required for connecting the sediment basin to the west end of the HE 68" x 106" pipe culvert as described on the Plans.

All costs of this work shall be included in the lump sum price bid for PRECAST R.C. SEDIMENT BASIN, 4' X 9' X 2.50' DEEP.

CONCRETE HEADWALL/WINGWALL STRUCTURE.

This work shall be completed in accordance with Section 503 and 508 of the Standard Specifications and shall include all excavation for the headwall/wingwall structure including any dewatering, if necessary. Any required CA-7 crushed stone will be paid for separately as Granular Bedding & Backfill Material Special. Work to include all formwork, furnishing and setting all reinforcement bars, placing, finishing and curing all concrete, completing a rubbed finish on all concrete exposed to view, construction of a 48" high black powder coated steel ornamental fence on top of the wall and a poured concrete fillet, all as detailed on the Plans. Fence to have vertical pickets with clear openings between pickets of not more than 4". All excess excavated material shall be removed from the site by Contractor with no additional compensation.

All costs of this work to be included in the lump sum bid for CONCRETE HEADWALL/WINGWALL STRUCTURE.

PAVED CONCRETE DITCH SPECIAL

This work shall be completed in accordance with Section 606 of the Standard Specifications and the details included in the Plans and is similar to Standard 606401-02. Work includes all necessary excavation including dewatering, if necessary, all formwork, setting all welded wire reinforcing mesh, placing, finishing, jointing and curing all concrete. Sawed contraction joints in the paved concrete ditch to be 1 3/4" minimum depth. Provide a light broom finish for the paved concrete ditch. Any required CA-7 crushed stone beneath the paved concrete ditch will be paid for separately as Granular Bedding & Backfill Material Special. All excess excavated material shall be removed from the site by Contractor with no additional compensation.

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All costs of this work to be included in the unit price bid per square yard for PAVED CONCRETE DITCH SPECIAL.

PIPE CULVERT TO BE CLEANED, 68" X 106",

STORM SEWER TO BE CLEANED, 36"

STORM SEWER TO BE CLEANED, 42"

This work includes completely cleaning all silt and other debris from the HE 68" x 106" pipe culvert beneath Parkside Drive and the 36" and 42" storm sewers that drain into said pipe culvert. There is a variable depth of silt and debris in these lines, but the depth appears to be approximately 24" to 30" at the downstream end of the pipe culvert. Contractor to verify the extent of this work before submitting their bid. Cleaning shall be completed by high pressure water jet cleaning, bucket machine cleaning or other means to complete this work so that all silt and other debris is removed from these lines. All of this work to be completed before any flow is permitted to be drained into the proposed 30" storm sewer at ST-6.

All costs of this work shall be included in the unit price bid per foot for PIPE CULVERT TO BE CLEANED, 68" X 106", STORM SEWER TO BE CLEANED, 36" AND STORM SEWER TO BE CLEANED, 42".

TRAFFIC CONTROL AND PROTECTION

This work shall be completed in accordance with Sections 701 of the Standard Specifications and the following traffic standards: STANDARD 701006-05, STANDARD 701501-06, STANDARD 701801-06 and STANDARD 701901-10. Before any work begins on this project, Contractor shall erect the 4' high orange plastic mesh safety fencing on the 506 and 516 properties as described in #1 of the Special Project Requirements. Type I, Type II and Type III barricades and cones and temporary No Parking signs shall be used to control traffic during this construction work. Traffic shall be maintained, for the most part on Parkside Drive and can be reduced to one lane only at certain times as approved by City. Notices will be delivered by the City to all residential properties, and others affected by this construction with pertinent information on the scope of the project including project limits and phases of construction, estimated start date for the construction work, approximate duration of the project, parking guidance and access to their driveways during construction, etc. as well as other applicable information on a case by case basis as may arise from time to time.

All costs of this work shall be included in the lump sum price for TRAFFIC CONTROL AND PROTECTION.

PAYMENT FOR EXTRA WORK

Payment for extra work will be in accordance with Section 109.04 of Standard Specifications. No claim for extra work will be allowed unless this work has been authorized by a representative of the City prior to the Contractor beginning this work. An Extra Work Daily Report (Form BC 635) shall be completed for any and all days in which extra work is performed and shall be signed each day by Contractor's representative and City's representative. Extra work which is approved by the City will be compensated on an agreed lump sum price or unit price. Computations to arrive at an agreed price shall be basically in accordance with these same IDOT guidelines with respect to labor, materials and equipment costs.

PROSECUTION AND PROGRESS

Section 108.01 of the Standard Specifications shall be amended by changing the requirement for the Contractor to perform with his own organization work amounting to not less than 50% of the total contract

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cost and with materials purchased or produced by the Contractor to not less than 25% of the total contract cost and with materials purchased or produced by Contractor.

INSURANCE

Proper insurance shall be provided as required in Article 107.27 of the Specifications except that the City of Sycamore and their agents and consultants shall be included as an additional insured or provided separate coverage with an owner's protective policy. Proper certificates of insurance shall be submitted to the City of Sycamore.

BONDS

Payment and performance bonds in the amount of 100% of the contract cost are required for this project. Contractor shall have the option of providing a Letter of Credit for the full amount of the contract instead of the payment and performance bonds. The Letter of Credit shall conform to the applicable portions of Section 4.7.3 of the City of Sycamore's Unified Development Ordinance and be in a format approved by the City of Sycamore.

CONSTRUCTION STAKING

All construction staking will be completed by the Engineer assigned by City.

COMPLETION DATE

All work for this project shall be completed by November 25, 2025. The completion date set forth herein is based on the City of Sycamore receiving proposals and awarding the contract by July 21, 2025. In the event that all work is not completed by this date then the Contractor will be liable and shall pay to the City of Sycamore liquidated damages in the amount as set forth in Article 108.09 of the Standard Specifications for each calendar day of overrun in the contract time. The liquidated damages shall accrue and be assessed until all work is completed.

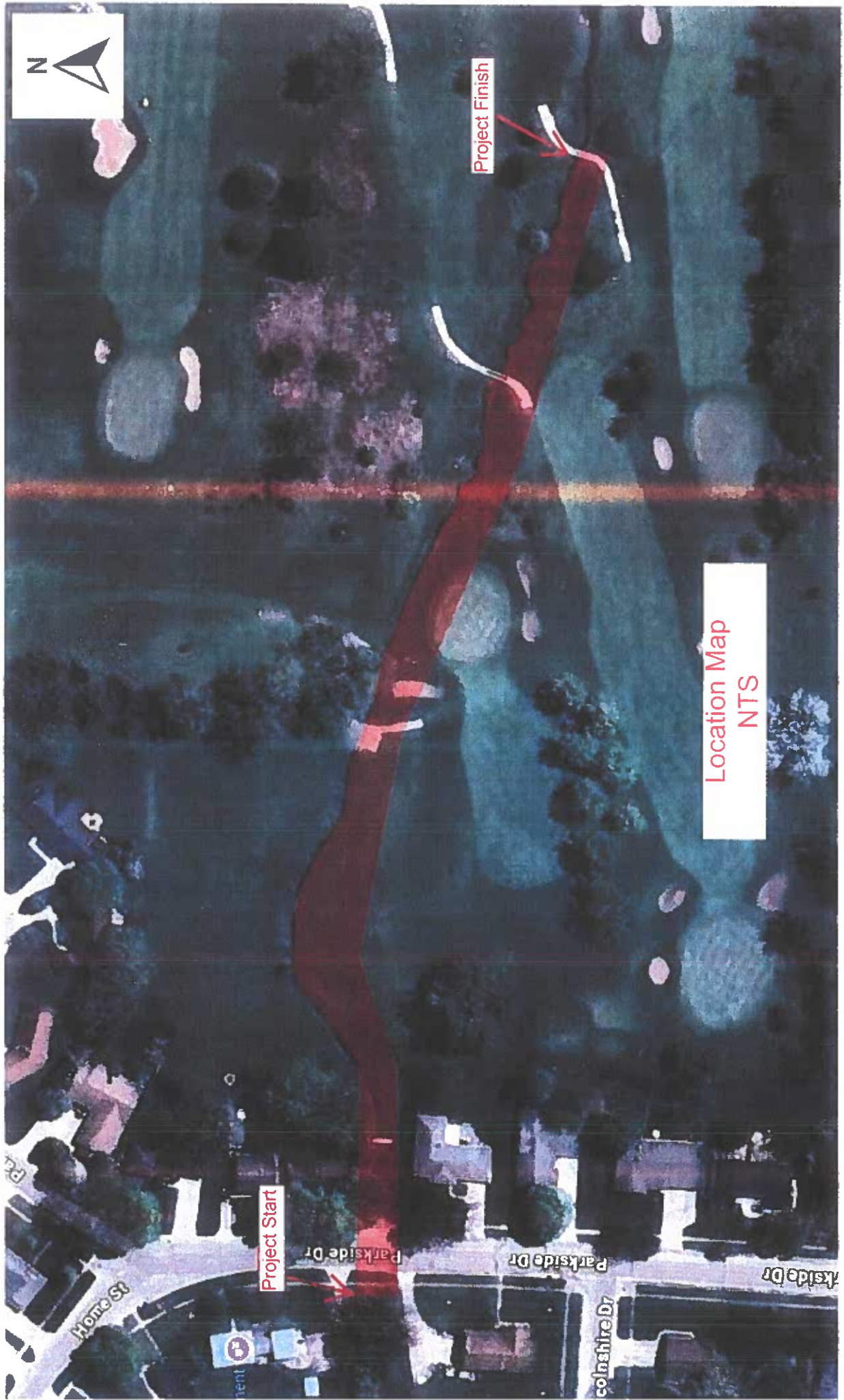

SILT FILTER J-HOOK PLACEMENT



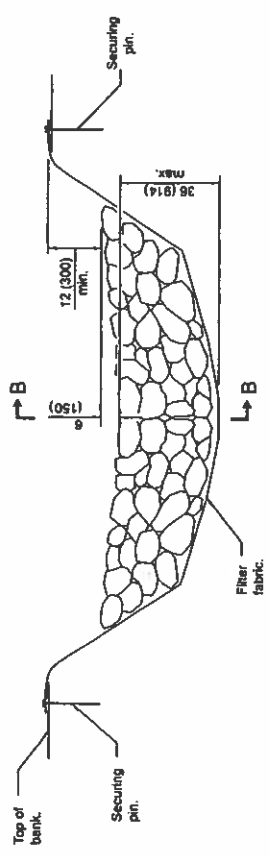

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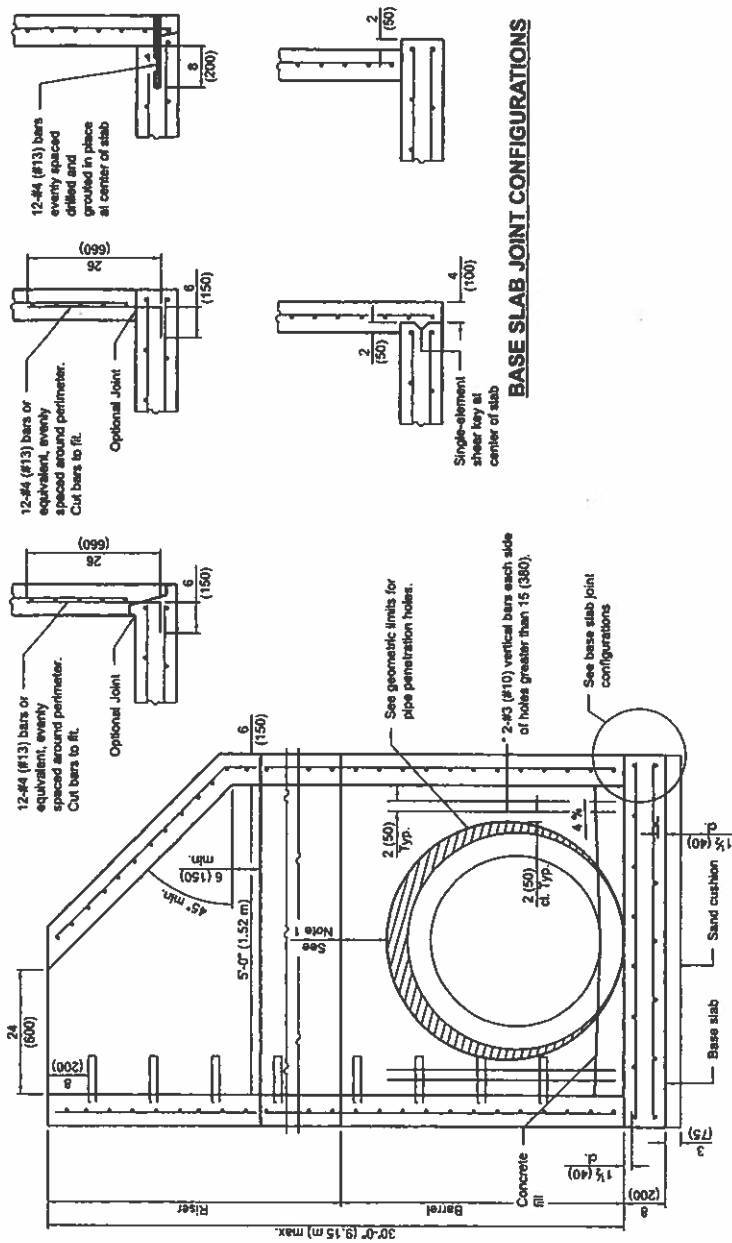


SECTION PARALLEL TO PIPE (Without conical top riser)

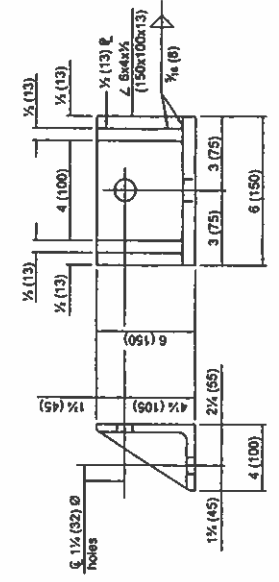
PLAN - FLAT SLAB TOP
(Showing layout of bottom reinforcement bars and c bars)



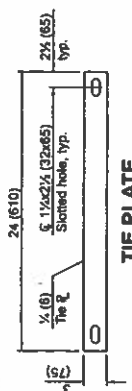
PLAN - FLAT SLAB TOP

ASBESTOS - GENERAL - removal of asbestos material/mold and hazardous materials from any place in a building, including mechanical systems where those mechanical systems are to be removed. This includes the removal of asbestos materials/mold and hazardous materials from ductwork or pipes in a building when the building is to be demolished at the time or at some close future date.

ASBESTOS - MECHANICAL - removal of asbestos material from mechanical systems, such as pipes, ducts, and boilers, where the mechanical systems are to remain.

CERAMIC TILE FINISHER

The grouting, cleaning, and polishing of all classes of tile, whether for interior or exterior purposes, all burned, glazed or unglazed products; all composition materials, granite tiles, warning detectable tiles, cement tiles, epoxy composite materials, pavers, glass, mosaics, fiberglass, and all substitute materials, for tile made in tile-like units; all mixtures in tile like form of cement, metals, and other materials that are for and intended for use as a finished floor surface, stair treads, promenade roofs, walks, walls, ceilings, swimming pools, and all other places where tile is to form a finished interior or exterior. The mixing of all setting mortars including but not limited to thin-set mortars, epoxies, wall mud, and any other sand and cement mixtures or adhesives when used in the preparation, installation, repair, or maintenance of tile and/or similar materials. The handling and unloading of all sand, cement, lime, tile, fixtures, equipment, adhesives, or any other materials to be used in the preparation, installation, repair, or maintenance of tile and/or similar materials. Ceramic Tile Finishers shall fill all joints and voids regardless of method on all tile work, particularly and especially after installation of said tile work. Application of any and all protective coverings to all types of tile installations including, but not be limited to, all soap compounds, paper products, tapes, and all polyethylene coverings, plywood, masonite, cardboard, and any new type of products that may be used to protect tile installations, Blastrac equipment, and all floor scarifying equipment used in preparing floors to receive tile. The clean up and removal of all waste and materials. All demolition of existing tile floors and walls to be re-tiled.

COMMUNICATIONS TECHNICIAN

Installing, manufacturing, assembling and maintaining sound and intercom, protection alarm (security), fire alarm, master antenna television, closed circuit television, low voltage control for computers and/or door monitoring, school communications systems, telephones and servicing of nurse and emergency calls, and the installation and maintenance of transmit and receive antennas, transmitters, receivers, and associated apparatus which operates in conjunction with above systems. All work associated with these system installations will be included EXCEPT the installation of protective metallic conduit in new construction projects (excluding less than ten-foot, runs strictly for protection of cable) and 120 volt AC (or higher) power wiring and associated hardware.

LABORER, SKILLED - HIGHWAY

Individuals engaged in the following types of work, irrespective of the site of the work: asbestos abatement worker, handling of any materials with any foreign matter harmful to skin or clothing, track laborer, cement handlers, chloride handlers, the unloading and loading with steel workers and re-bars, concrete workers wet, tunnel helpers in free air, batch dumpers, mason tenders, kettle and tar men, tank cleaners, plastic installers, scaffold workers, motorized buggies or motorized unit used for wet concrete or handling of building materials, laborers with de-watering systems, sewer workers plus depth, rod and chainmen with technical

TERRAZZO FINISHER

The handling of sand, cement, marble chips, and all other materials that may be used by the Mosaic Terrazzo Mechanic, and the mixing, grinding, grouting, cleaning and sealing of all Marble, Mosaic, and Terrazzo work, floors, base, stairs, and wainscoting by hand or machine, and in addition, assisting and aiding Marble, Masonic, and Terrazzo Mechanics.

TRUCK DRIVER - BUILDING, HEAVY AND HIGHWAY CONSTRUCTION Class 1. Two or three Axle Trucks. 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Other Classifications of Work:

For definitions of classifications not otherwise set out, the Department generally has on file such definitions which are available. If a task to be performed is not subject to one of the classifications of pay set out, the Department will upon being contacted state which neighboring county has such a classification and provide such rate, such rate being deemed to exist by reference in this document. If no neighboring county rate applies to the task, the Department shall undertake a special determination, such special determination being then deemed to have existed under this determination. If a project requires these, or any classification not listed, please contact IDOL at 217-782-1710 for wage rates or clarifications.

LANDSCAPING

Landscaping work falls under the existing classifications for laborer, operating engineer and truck driver. The work performed by landscape plantsman and landscape laborer is covered by the existing classification of laborer. The work performed by landscape operators (regardless of equipment used or its size) is covered by the classifications of operating engineer. The work performed by landscape truck drivers (regardless of size of truck driven) is covered by the classifications of truck driver.
